

RAPIDES PARISH POLICE JURY

REGULAR SESSION
DECEMBER 14, 2009

The Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Room of the Parish Courthouse, 701 Murray Street, Alexandria, Louisiana, on Monday, December 14, 2009, at three (3:00) o'clock p.m. (Central Standard Time).

There were present: Joe Bishop, Vice President and Chairman Pro Tem, and Police Jurors John "Buck" Lincecum, Jamie L. Floyd, Richard Gerald Vanderlick, Oliver "Ollie" Overton Jr., Richard W. Billings, and Scott Perry Jr.

Police Jurors absent were: Theodore Fountaine Jr., President, and Steve Coco.

Also present were Mr. Tim Ware, Treasurer; Ms. Elaine Morace, WIA Operations Director; Mr. Jason Parks, Economic and Workforce Development Director; Mr. Dennis Woodward, Public Works Director; Mr. Shannon Trapp, Courthouse and Jail Building Superintendent; Ms. Linda Sanders, Civil Service Director; Chief David Peart, Fire District No. 2; Mr. Thomas O. Wells, Legal Counsel; and Ms. Angie Richmond, Secretary.

The invocation was given by Mr. Dennis Woodward.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Ollie Overton.

The Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said Parish by Hon. Joe Bishop, Vice President and Chairman Pro Tem, who welcomed all present and then stated that the Police Jury was ready for the first item of business.

On motion by Mr. Richard Billings, seconded by Mr. Buck Lincecum, to adopt the minutes of the Rapides Parish Police Jury held in Regular Session on November 9, 2009, as published in the Official Journal. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Buck Lincecum, seconded by Mr. Ollie Overton and Mr. Jamie Floyd, that approved bills be paid. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Richard Billings and Mr. Buck Lincecum, seconded by Mr. Ollie Overton, to accept the Treasurer's Report. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Ollie Overton, seconded by Mr. Buck Lincecum, to reappoint Mr. Byron McGee to the Fire District No. 4 Civil Service Board, nominee of Louisiana College, for a three year term, term will expire on November 12, 2012. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Richard Vanderlick, seconded by Mr. Buck Lincecum and Mr. Scott Perry, to lay over the appointment to the Children and Youth Planning Board to fill a vacancy in an unexpired term, representing the social services community, term will expire on October 11, 2010. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Ollie Overton, seconded by Mr. Jamie Floyd, to reappoint Mr. Ronald Dorsey to the Alexandria Central Economic Development District, representing the Rapides Parish Police Jury, for a four year term, term will expire on December 14, 2013. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Richard Vanderlick, seconded by Mr. Richard Billings, to reappoint Mr. Duane Blackwell to the Alexandria Central Economic Development District, representing the Rapides Parish Police Jury, for a four year term, term will expire on December 14, 2013. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Jamie Floyd, seconded by Mr. Ollie Overton, to lay over the appointment to the Esler Industrial Development Area Advisory Board, representing District G, for a five year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. Jerry Alan Cripps, term will expire on January 11, 2010. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Ollie Overton, seconded by Mr. Scott Perry, to reappoint Mr. Lue Howard to the Gravity Drainage District No. 1 for a four year term, term will expire on January 15, 2014. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Richard Vanderlick, seconded by Mr. Ollie Overton, the following appointments were announced to be made at the next meeting to:

Fire District No. 7 Civil Service Board for a three year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. Don Calhoon, representing the Rapides Parish Police Jury, term will expire on February 7, 2010;

Board on the Code of Ethics for one year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. James Arthur Williams, term will expire on February 9, 2010;

Buckeye Recreation District for a five year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. Jeffrey Thompson, term will expire on February 12, 2010;

Communications District for a four year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. Sam J. DeBona (Private

Enterprise), term will expire on February 18, 2010; and

Communications District for a four year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. Jack DeWitt (Parish and State Government), term will expire on February 18, 2010.

On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Richard Vanderlick, seconded by Mr. Ollie Overton, to hold a public hearing on the amendment of the boundaries of Road District No. 1B to be outside the corporate limits of the City of Alexandria. On vote the motion carried.

The President asked if there was anyone who wished to be heard, to which there was no response.

The public hearing was then declared closed.

On motion by Mr. Buck Lincecum, seconded by Mr. Ollie Overton, the following ordinance was presented:

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REENACTING SECTION 21-110 OF THE RAPIDES PARISH CODE OF ORDINANCES RELATIVE TO AMENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF ROAD DISTRICT NO. 1B OF THE PARISH OF RAPIDES, STATE OF LOUISIANA, DEFINING AND DESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER DETAILS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Rapides Parish Police Jury, held on October 12, 2009 said Police Jury acting under the authority of Section 3811 of Title 33 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 33:3811), and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, adopted a resolution giving notice of the intention to change or alter the boundaries of Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana and describing the territory of which said District was to be composed, the boundaries thereof and other matters required by law, and provided that said Police Jury would meet in open and public session on December 14, 2009 at 3:00 p.m. at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Meeting Room, located in the Rapides Parish Courthouse, Alexandria, Louisiana, and proceed to change or alter the boundaries of said District; and

WHEREAS, notice of said intention has been duly published once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks in the official journal of this Police Jury, the first publication being more than thirty (30) days prior to this date; and

WHEREAS, no objections or protests were presented to the Police Jury relative to changing or altering the boundaries of Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides; and

WHEREAS, this Police Jury has determined that changing or altering the boundaries of said District would benefit and be to the best interest of the Parish and the inhabitants of the area affected;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish:

SECTION 1. Section 21-110 of the Rapides Parish Code of Ordinances is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Chapter 21. Special Districts

Article V Roads

Division 2. District No. 1B

Section 21-110. That, by virtue of the authority conferred by Part II, Chapter 2, Title 48 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 (R.S. 48:571 et seq.), and other constitutional and statutory authority supplemental thereto, the boundaries of Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, shall comprise, embrace, and include all of the following described territory, to-wit:

All of the territory within the boundaries of Police Jury Ward No. 1 of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, as the same is presently constituted, less and except all that territory presently within the corporate limits of the City of Alexandria, Louisiana, as of December 14, 2009.

SECTION 2. That due notice of the amendment of the boundaries of Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, shall be published in the official journal of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that his ordinance is to be effective immediately.

RESOLUTION

A resolution ordering and calling a special election to be held in Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, to authorize the levy of a special tax therein; making application to the State Bond Commission in connection therewith; and providing for other matters in connection therewith.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana (the "District"), that:

SECTION 1. Election Call. Subject to the approval of the State Bond Commission, and under the authority conferred by Article VI, Sections 30 and 32 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, the applicable provisions of Chapter 5 and Chapter 6-A of the Louisiana Election Code, and other constitutional and statutory authority, a special election is hereby called and ordered to be held in the District on **SATURDAY, MAY 1, 2010**, between the hours of six o'clock (6:00) a.m., and eight o'clock (8:00) p.m., in accordance with the provisions of La. R.S. 18:541, and at the said election there shall be submitted to all registered voters qualified and entitled to vote at the said election under the Constitution and laws of this State and the Constitution of the United States, the following proposition, to-wit:

ROAD DISTRICT NO. 1B

SUMMARY: AUTHORITY TO LEVY A 10 YEAR 15 MILL PROPERTY TAX RENEWAL FOR CONSTRUCTING, MAINTAINING AND KEEPING IN REPAIR THE PUBLIC ROADS, HIGHWAYS AND BRIDGES OF ROAD DISTRICT NO. 1B.

Shall Road District No. 1B of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana (the "District"), levy and collect a special ad valorem tax of fifteen (15.00) mills on all the property subject to taxation within the confines of the District, for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2010 and ending with the year 2019 (an estimated \$290,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and keeping in repair the public roads, highways and bridges within said District?

SECTION 2. Publication of Notice of Election. A Notice of Special Election shall be published in the Alexandria Daily Town Talk, a daily newspaper of general circulation within the District, published in Alexandria, Louisiana, and being the official journal of the District, once a week for four consecutive weeks, with the first publication to be made not less than forty-five (45) days nor more than ninety (90) days prior to the date of the election, which Notice shall be substantially in the form attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference the same as if it were set forth herein in full.

SECTION 3. Canvass. This Governing Authority shall meet at its regular meeting place, the Rapides Parish Courthouse, 701 Murray Street, 2nd Floor, Alexandria, Louisiana, on **MONDAY, MAY 10, 2010**, at **THREE O'CLOCK (3:00) P.M.**, and shall then and there in open and public session proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the said special election.

SECTION 4. Polling Places. The polling places set forth in the aforesaid Notice of Special Election are hereby designated as the polling places at which to hold the said election, and the Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners, respectively, will be the same persons as those designated in accordance with law.

SECTION 5. Election Commissioners; Voting Machines. The officers designated to serve as Commissioners-in-Charge and Commissioners pursuant to Section 4 hereof, or such substitutes therefor as may be selected and designated in accordance with La. R.S. 18:1287, shall hold the said special election as herein provided, and shall make due returns of said election for the meeting of the Governing Authority to be held on Monday, May 10, 2010, as provided in Section 3 hereof. All registered voters in the District will be entitled to vote at the special election, and voting machines shall be used.

SECTION 6. Authorization of Officers. The Secretary of the Governing Authority is hereby empowered, authorized and directed to arrange for and to furnish to said election officers in ample time for the holding of said election, the necessary equipment, forms and other paraphernalia essential to the proper holding of said election and the President and/or Secretary of the Governing Authority are further authorized, empowered and directed to take any and all further action required by State and/or Federal law to arrange for the election, including but not limited to, appropriate submission to the Federal Department of Justice under Section 5 of the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

SECTION 7. Furnishing Election Call to Election Officials. Certified copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Parish Custodian of Voting Machines of Rapides Parish and the Registrar of Voters of Rapides Parish, as notification of the special election, in order

that each may prepare for said election and perform their respective functions as required by law.

SECTION 8. Application to State Bond Commission. Application is made to the State Bond Commission for consent and authority to hold the special election as herein provided, and in the event said election carries for further consent and authority to levy and collect the special tax provided for therein. A certified copy of this resolution shall be forwarded to the State Bond Commission on behalf of this Governing Authority, together with a letter requesting the prompt consideration and approval of this application.

This resolution having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows:

SECTION 2. The attached estimates of expenditures for certain funds is hereby adopted to serve as a budget of expenditures for these funds for the Police Jury of Rapides Parish during the same period.

SECTION 3. The adoption of this operating budget of expenditures be and the same is hereby declared to operate as an appropriation of the amount therein set forth within the terms of the budget classification.

SECTION 4. Amounts are available for expenditure only to the extent included within the 2009 budget.

SECTION 5. The Treasurer shall have the authority to make any changes and amendments to any agencies, departments, functions, characters and funds within the adopted budget as he deems necessary provided that the provisions of LA R.S. 39:1310 (A) are followed.

R.S. 33:3811, et seq.), the Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, created Kolin-Ruby Wise Waterworks District No. 11A of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana (the "District"), by virtue of an ordinance adopted on July 8, 1969; and

WHEREAS, the District proposes to construct and acquire additions, extensions and improvements to its waterworks system (the "System"), and to finance a portion of the cost thereof through the issuance of its water revenue bonds, secured by and payable solely from the revenues of the System, after the District has paid from those revenues the reasonable and necessary expenses of operating and maintaining the System, pursuant to the provisions of Part XIII, Chapter 4, Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 39:1011 through 1024, inclusive) (the "Act"), and other constitutional and statutory authority; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority of the Act, the Board of Waterworks Commissioners of the District adopted a resolution on October 29, 2009, giving notice of its intention to issue water revenue bonds of the District in an amount not exceeding Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) without the necessity of the holding of an election thereon, and the District will hold a public hearing on or about December 17, 2009, to hear any objections to the issuance of such Bonds or petitions filed requesting an election thereon; and

WHEREAS, after holding the said public hearing, the Board of Waterworks Commissioners of the District will also adopt resolutions (collectively, the "Bond Resolution") authorizing the issuance of not exceeding Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) of its Water Revenue Bonds (the "Bonds"), prescribing the form, fixing the details, and providing for the payment thereof, confirming the sale thereof and entering into certain other covenants and agreements in connection with the security and payment of the Bonds, and providing for other matters in connection with the foregoing; and

WHEREAS, as required by Article VI, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and La. R.S. 33:1415(B) it is now the desire of this Parish Council to approve the issuance of the Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish, that:

SECTION 1. In compliance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, La. R.S. 33:1415(B) and other authority supplemental thereto, and in accordance with the request of the Board of Waterworks Commissioners of Kolin-Ruby Wise Waterworks District No. 11A of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, this governing authority hereby approves the issuance, sale and delivery of Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000) of its Water Revenue Bonds pursuant to the Act, for the purpose of financing the Project, all as described and defined in the preambles hereto.

SECTION 2. The Bonds shall be secured by and payable solely from the revenues derived or to be derived from the operation of the waterworks system of the District, as set forth in the Bond Resolution, and neither the Parish of Rapides nor this governing authority shall in any way be liable for the payment of the principal of and/or interest on the Bonds.

WHEREAS, the City is authorized by Louisiana law to construct roads and improvements for its citizens and is completing the extension of Versailles Boulevard with plans to connect the thoroughfare with Coliseum Boulevard and desires, with the cooperation of the State of Louisiana, Department of Transportation and Development to obtain closure of two crossovers on Coliseum Boulevard presently adjacent to the Police Jury property and to provide traffic control lights on the intersection of Versailles Boulevard and Coliseum Boulevard; and

WHEREAS, the Rapides Parish Police Jury owns property on Coliseum Boulevard commonly referred to as the Rapides Parish Coliseum and has other parish property adjacent thereto that is leased to the Rapides Parish Coliseum Authority, State of Louisiana and other agencies all located on property adjacent to the Coliseum within the City of Alexandria, Louisiana;

WHEREAS, the City desires to obtain the consent of the Police Jury and the Rapides Parish Coliseum Authority for its stated intentions; and

WHEREAS, the City has offered to, at its own cost and expense, provide certain improvements for parking and driveways on Police Jury property to serve and benefit the public and its citizens to relieve congestion and traffic flow concerns; and

WHEREAS, the Police Jury is willing to grant consent to the City for the closure of the two crossovers and the construction of necessary public works on its property; and

WHEREAS, the Police Jury and the City have determined that this Intergovernmental Agreement is in the best interests of the public and furthers the general objectives of the Police Jury and the City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AGREED by and between the Police Jury and the City that for the public

purposes stated the Police Jury does consent as an adjacent property owner to the closure of two crossovers on Coliseum Boulevard; the improvement of the remaining crossover with installation of traffic control devices all at the expense of the City and the additional considerations expressed and for the mutual benefits to be received by the Police Jury and the public, the City and the Police Jury agrees as follows:

ARTICLE I.

The Police Jury consents to the closure of the two crossovers in front of the Rapides Parish Coliseum and Police Jury adjacent property (Office of Motor Vehicles) on Coliseum Boulevard by the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (D.O.T.D.), all as is shown by the aerial diagram titled "Highway 28 West Development", prepared by Meyer, Meyer, LaCroix & Hixson (Exhibit A).

Article II.

- (A) In order to offset any damages the closure of the crossovers have to the Coliseum property, the City agrees at its cost and expense to close two crossovers and install traffic control devices and construct and improve turning lanes for the remaining Versailles Boulevard-Coliseum Boulevard crossover at the location as is shown by the attached diagram prepared by Mike Wilkerson, City Engineer (Exhibit B).
- B) The City will grant a twenty-eight foot right of way/servitude to the Rapides Parish Police Jury for the construction of a road marked in orange on Exhibit B, the road shall be constructed at the sole cost of the City and shall connect the existing road along the eastern side of the Coliseum to Highway 28 West crossover connection adjacent to the National Guard Armory. The City agrees to execute any and all documents necessary to establish this servitude in favor of the Rapides Parish Police Jury.
- C) To facilitate parking and public traffic ingress and egress from Police Jury property, the City at its sole cost and expense agrees to extend parking spaces between the D.O.T.D. right of way and the property and improvements currently leased by the Police Jury to the Department of Motor Vehicles. This parking area shall be angled for one-way traffic.
- D) The City also at its cost and expense will widen the existing Police Jury driveway at the Versailles Boulevard connection crossover accessing the Police Jury parking lot between the Coliseum and public buildings, such as the Department of Motor Vehicles office.
- E) The City will also construct public improvements on Police Jury property in front of the Coliseum to provide additional and extensions of parking space for fire and other emergency vehicles needing parking spaces in front of the Coliseum.
- F) The City will also construct a crushed limestone road around the rear of the Coliseum (area marked in pink on Exhibit B).
- G) The City will also construct a concrete parking area connecting to the crushed limestone road (area marked in blue on Exhibit B).
- H) The public improvements to be constructed by the City shall be part of the contract for the Versailles Boulevard connection and shall be constructed at the same time as when the Versailles Boulevard connection is made to Highway 28 West. The construction standards shall meet or exceed those required by the Alexandria City Code of Ordinances.
- I) The City agrees to make every effort during construction so as to reduce the impact construction activity may have on events held at the Coliseum.

ARTICLE III.

The Rapides Parish Coliseum joins in the consent to the closure of the crossovers and its appropriate representative appears in order to concur with the consent agreement set out herein.

Section 1. A certain piece, parcel or lot of ground together with all buildings, improvements, right ways and privileges thereto belonging, situated in the City of Alexandria, Louisiana, and being described as follows:

Lot Fronting 50.5' on 8th Street x 51' on alley adjacent to Zilla Harris Subdivision, Lot Fronting 32' on alley x 1-6' adjacent to Zilla Harris Subdivision.

Municipal address of the Property: 2416 8th Street, Alexandria, Louisiana, 71301

should be re-entered into the stream of commerce thereby serving the public interest.

Section 2. The acquiring person shall certify, in writing, to the Purchasing Department that he/she or his/her agent has searched for all names and last known addresses of all owners, mortgages, and any other person(s) who may have a vested or contingent interest in the property, or who have filed a request for notice as indicated in those records and has so examined:

- a) the mortgage and conveyance records of Rapides Parish,
- b) the current telephone book,
- c) any other examination resources, including Internet search engines, if any, the records of the Louisiana Secretary of State and the Secretary of States set forth by the names of identified entities.

Section 3. The acquiring person shall submit the required notifications (R.S.47:2206 A and B) to the Civil Sheriff for his/her signature, and then notify those persons identified via regular mail, certified mail*, publication and/or service of process. *Copies of the "green and white receipts" should be maintained by the purchaser as indicia of compliance with the notice requirements;

Section 4. The acquiring person shall send a written notice notifying any tax sale party whose interest the successful bidder or donee intends to be terminated that the party has until the later of the following to redeem the property or otherwise challenge in a court of competent jurisdiction the potential sale or donation:

- a) Sixty days from the date of the notice provided in this Subsection, if five years have elapsed from the filing of the tax sale certificate (formerly "proces verbal"), or six months after the date of the notice provided for in this Subsection, if five years have not elapsed since the filing of the tax sale certificate (formerly "proces verbal");
- b) The filing of the sale or donation transferring the property.
- c) The written notice required by this Section shall be that which is included in R.S. 47:2206 A. (2).

Section 5. The acquiring person shall cause to be published in the official journal of this parish (currently the Town Talk) a notice that any tax sale party whose interest the successful bidder or donee intends to be terminated has, to redeem the property, until the later of:

- a) Sixty days, for property on which a tax sale certificate (formerly "proces verbal") was filed over five years previous of the first publication, or six months if the tax sale certificate (formerly "proces verbal") was filed less than five years before the first publication of the notice provided for in this Subsection.
- b) The filing of the sale or donation transferring the property.
- c) The publication required by this Section shall be that which is included in R.S. 47:2206 B. (2).

Section 6. The acquiring person may file with the recorder of mortgages a copy of one of the notices that was sent to the tax debtor or the current owner. A transfer, mortgage, lien, privilege, or other encumbrance filed after the filing of the notice shall not affect the property. the recorder of mortgages or recorder of conveyances shall cancel, erase, terminate, or release the acts upon the request of the acquiring person.

Section 7. At any time after the expiration of the sixty-day or six-month periods, as applicable, set forth in R.S. 47:2206 (A) and (B), the acquiring person, or his/her successors and assigns, may send to this body a written notice requesting that the sale/donation to him/her be authenticated. The President of the Jury shall authenticate the sale or donation within ten days from the date of the request or as soon thereafter as practical. However, the President shall not execute the act of cash sale or act of donation until the District Attorney's office has certified in writing to the President, that purchaser or donee has complied with the mandates of this Ordinance. The sale price shall be paid by cashier's check or money order at the time of the sale.

NOTE: The initial application fee of \$75.00 and any other costs incurred by the purchaser shall not be applied to the purchase price and shall not be refundable if the purchaser elects not to complete the process.

NOTE: The City of Alexandria and/or the City of Pineville and/or the Parish of Rapides shall reserve all oil, gas and other mineral rights in and to the property to be conveyed, but shall convey the surface rights of the said property.

Section 8. The acquiring person shall be responsible for filing the sale or donation and payment of all filing fees.

Section 9. The only warranty owed by the political subdivision or the municipalities shall be a warranty against eviction resulting from a prior alienation by the political subdivision or the municipality.

- a) All sales and donations shall be without warranty, either expressed or implied, even as to return or reduction of the purchase price, including without limitation the warranty against redhibitory defects or vices and the warranty that the thing sold is reasonable fit for its ordinary purpose or the acquiring person's intended or particular purpose.
- b) These waivers or exclusions of warranties shall be self-operative regardless of whether the waivers or exclusions are contained in the act of sale or donation, and regardless of whether they are clear and unambiguous, and regardless of whether they are brought to the attention of the acquiring person. This provision supersedes the requirements of any other law.
- c) The writing constituting the sale shall be in the form as provided in R.S. 47:2207 B. and the writing constituting the donation shall be that which is included in R.S. 47:2207 C.

Section 10. The provisions of R.S. 41:1338 shall not apply to the property being sold or donated in accordance with this Ordinance.

Section 11. A certified copy of the sale or donation shall be prima facie evidence of the regularity of all matters dealing with the sale or donation and the validity of the sale or donation.

Section 12. Contemporaneously with or subsequent to the filing of the sale or donation of adjudicated property, the acquiring person, his/her successors, or assigns, may file with the recorder of mortgages an affidavit indicating how the tax sale parties whose interest the acquiring person, his/her successors, or assigns, intends to be terminated were identified, how the address of each tax sale party was obtained, how the written notice was sent, the results of sending the written notice, and the dates of publication.

- a) The affidavit may also contain a statement of the interest to which the purchaser or donee takes subject. The recorder of mortgages shall index the affidavit only under the names of the owner filing the affidavit and the tax debtor, as mortgagors.
- b) The affidavit described herein shall be sufficient if it follows the form articulated in R.S. 47:2208.
- c) With respect to a sale, the filing of the affidavit provided herein shall operate as a cancellation, termination, release, or erasure of record of all statutory impositions of all political subdivisions then due and owing, of all governmental liens, and of all interests, liens, mortgages, privileges, and other encumbrances recorded against the property sold and listed in the affidavit.
- d) With respect to a donation, the filing of the affidavit provided herein shall operate as a cancellation, termination, release, or erasure of record of all statutory impositions of all political subdivisions then due and owing, of all governmental liens, and of all interests, liens, mortgages, privileges, and other encumbrances recorded against the property sold and listed in the affidavit.
- e) Upon filing of the affidavit, the recorder of mortgages or the recorder of conveyances shall treat as canceled, terminated, released, or erased, all those liens, privileges, mortgages or other encumbrances canceled, terminated, released or erased under subsections (c) or (d) of this Section, only insofar as they affect the property.
- f) The owner filing the affidavit shall be liable to and indemnify the recorder of mortgages, the recorder of conveyances, and any other person relying on the cancellation, termination, release, or erasure by affidavit for any damages that they may suffer as a consequence of such reliance if the recorded affidavit contains materially false or incorrect statements that cause the recorder to incorrectly cancel, terminate, release, or erase any interest listed in the affidavit. The

recorder of mortgages and the recorder of conveyances shall not be liable for any damages resulting to any person or entity as a consequence of the cancellation, termination, release or erasure of any interest in compliance with this Section.

THUS PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED on this 14th day of December, 2009.

On motion by Mr. Richard Billings, seconded by Mr. Richard Vanderlick, to authorize the President to sign the Sub-Grantee Agreement and related documents with the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness for the Coliseum and Exhibition Hall Retrofit and Roof Upgrade, Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, HMGP Project No. FEMA-LA-1603n-079-001, CFDA No. 97.039, on the grant award of \$704,859.00, as recommended by the Rapides Area Planning Commission. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Jamie Floyd, seconded by Mr. Richard Billings and Mr. Ollie Overton, to authorize Ms. Marilyn Thrasher, 3037 Hwy 112, Forest Hill, LA 71430, as a Hardship Case, pending proper certification. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Jamie Floyd, seconded by Mr. Richard Billings and Mr. Ollie Overton, to authorize expenses of interested Police Jurors and the Treasurer to attend the Statewide Technical Assistance Workshop on Gustav/Ike Disaster CDBG Program Implementation to be held on December 16, 2009 in Lafayette. On vote the motion carried.
