

RAPIDES PARISH POLICE JURY

REGULAR SESSION

MAY 9, 2005

The Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, met in Regular Session at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Room of the Parish Courthouse, 701 Murray Street, Alexandria, Louisiana, on Monday, May 9, 2005, at three (3:00) o'clock p.m. (Central Standard Time).

There were present: Honorable Ezra L. Reed, President; Jerry P. Wood Sr., Vice President; and Police Jurors Richard "Butch" Lindsay, Steve P. Bordelon, Theodore Fountaine Jr., Donald H. Wilmore, Richard W. Billings, and Scott Perry Jr.

Police Juror Joe Fuller was absent.

Also present were Mr. Tim Ware, Treasurer; Mr. Eric S. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Butch Lindsay.

The Police Jury of the Parish of Rapides, State of Louisiana, was duly convened as the governing authority of said Parish by Hon. Ezra L. Reed, President, who welcomed all present and then stated that the Police Jury was ready for the transaction of business.

On motion by Mr. Steve Bordelon, seconded by Mr. Scott Perry, to adopt the minutes of the Rapides Parish Police Jury held in Regular Session on April 11, 2005, in Special Session on April 25, 2005, as published in the Official Journal. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Steve Bordelon, seconded by Mr. Scott Perry, that approved bills be paid. On vote the motion carried.

On motion by Mr. Steve Bordelon, seconded by Mr. Scott Perry, to accept the Treasurer's Report. On vote the motion carried.

Mr. Bordelon laid over the appointment to the Ruby-Wise Recreation District to fill the vacancy in an unexpired term created by the death of the late Eddie Cannon, term will expire on February 18, 2006.

Mr. Wilmore laid over the appointment to the Ward 7 Recreation District for a five year term to fill the expired term of Mr. Edward Thomas, term expired on April 13, 2003.

Mr. Billings laid over the appointment to the Ward 6 Recreation District for a five year term to fill the expiring term of Mr. Robert W. Cloud, term will expire on April 9, 2005.

WHEREAS, the Parochial Retirement System has proposed legislation, House Bill 378 of the 2005 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature, to change the definition of final compensation from the highest 36 consecutive months to the highest 60 consecutive months; and,

WHEREAS, the most important asset to the Rapides Parish Police Jury is its employees; and,

WHEREAS, the Rapides Parish Police Jury have verified that this change will adversely affect all employees of the Parish, resulting in them receiving a lesser benefit than they were promised when they joined the system; and,

WHEREAS, it is the belief of the Rapides Parish Police Jury that all existing employees under the Parochial Retirement System should receive what they were duly promised at the time of inclusion in the plan; and,

WHEREAS, the Rapides Parish Police Jury believes that this proposed change to the plan should be applied only to new employees hired after January 1, 2006;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rapides Parish Police Jury does hereby oppose any changes in the Parochial Retirement System benefits for existing Parish employees and further requests that the plan change (House Bill 378) be applied only to new employees which are hired after January 1, 2006;
